## Senate Bill 125

JOINT APPROPRIATIONS ENGROSSED

Introduced by: Senator Reed

An Act to require the Department of Social Services to conduct a state-wide study on child care, to provide an appropriation therefor, and to declare an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

5 **Section 1.** During the 2024 interim, the Department of Social Services shall conduct a study

6 <u>on the provision and cost of child care in this state. The study must include:</u>

- 7 (1) An analysis of the difference in cost of child care among:
- 8 (a) Geographic locations in this state;
- 9 (b) The age ranges of children in care;
- 10 <u>(c) The times of year;</u>
- 11 (d) Care delivery locations;
- 12 (e) Care delivery at different quality measures; and
- 13 <u>(f) Licensing types;</u>
- 14 (2) An analysis of the impact of inflation, population growth, and business growth on
  15 child care providers;
- 16 (3) An analysis of the cost of compensation and benefits for child care workers; and
- 17 (4) The development of a cost estimation model of payment for the child care
  18 assistance program.

19 Section 2. <u>The Department of Social Services shall report the findings of the study and any</u>

- 20 policy recommendations or proposed legislation to the Legislature no later than October 31,
- 21 <u>2024.</u>
- 22 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$1 to the

23 Department of Social Services, for the purpose of conducting or contracting for the completion

24 <u>of the study referenced in section 1 of this Act.</u>

- 1 Section 4. The secretary of the Department of Social Services shall approve vouchers and
- 2 the state auditor shall draw warrants to pay expenditures authorized by this Act.
- 3 Section 5. Any amounts appropriated in this Act not lawfully expended or obligated shall
- 4 revert in accordance with the procedures prescribed in chapter 4-8.
- 5 Section 6. Whereas, this Act is necessary for the support of the state government and its
- 6 <u>existing public institutions, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in</u>
- 7 <u>full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.</u>
