1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require the mandatory reporting of abuse or neglect of 2 elderly or disabled adults. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: 4 Section 1. That chapter 22-46 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as 5 follows: 6 Any person who is a: 7 (1) Physician, dentist, doctor of osteopathy, chiropractor, optometrist, podiatrist, 8 religious healing practitioner, hospital intern or resident, nurse, paramedic, 9 emergency medical technician, hospital personnel engaged in the admission, 10 examination, care, or treatment of elderly or disabled adults or any health care 11 professional; 12 (2) Nursing home staff member, assisted living facility staff member, adult day care 13 center staff member, residential caregiver, social worker, or any individual providing 14 homemaker services;

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(4) Psychologist, mental health professional, or counselor; or

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- 2 (5) State, county, or municipal criminal justice employee or law enforcement officer;
- 3 who knows, or has reasonable cause to suspect, that an elder or disabled adult has been or is
- 4 being abused or neglected, shall immediately report such knowledge or suspicion orally or in
- 5 writing to the state's attorney of the county in which the elder or disabled adult resides or is
- 6 present, to the Department of Social Services, or to a law enforcement officer. Any person who
- 7 knowingly fails to make the required report is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- 8 Any person who knows or has reason to suspect that an elder or disabled adult has been
- 9 abused or neglected as defined in § 22-46-2 or 22-46-3 may report that information, regardless
- of whether that person is one of the mandatory reporters listed in this section.
