## SENATE BILL NO. 178

Introduced by: Senators Maher and Kloucek and Representatives Olson (Betty), Schrempp, and Verchio

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide for the issuance of reduced fee hunting and

2 fishing licenses to certain persons with disabilities.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 41-6-10.2 be amended to read as follows:

5 41-6-10.2. Any resident who meets the requirements of this section may apply to the 6 licensing office of the Department of Game, Fish and Parks in Pierre and receive a resident 7 small game license and a resident fishing license upon payment of a reduced fee to be 8 established by the Game, Fish and Parks Commission in rules promulgated pursuant to chapter 9 1-26. A resident is eligible for the reduced fee if the resident: 10 (1) Receives a veterans allotment for a total disability which is deemed a

- 11 service-connected injury or has received the United States Veterans' Administration
- 12 K Award;
- 13 (2) Has served on active duty in the armed forces of the United States or has served as
  14 a member of the armed forces reserve or national guard, and the resident is totally
  15 disabled for the purposes of receiving social security benefits;

1 (3) Was held as a prisoner of war; or Has Holds a disabled hunter permit issued pursuant to § 41-8-37 or has a total 2 (4) disability as defined by rules promulgated <u>pursuant to chapter 1-26</u> by the Game, Fish 3 4 and Parks Commission. 5 The resident small game license and the resident fishing license are valid for a period of four calendar years if the licensee remains a resident of the state. A veteran may provide proof at the 6 7 time of application of receipt of such an allotment, social security disability benefits, or award. 8 Any other applicant shall provide proof of total disability on a form provided by the Department 9 of Game, Fish and Parks.
