## SENATE BILL NO. 201

Introduced by: Senators Jensen, Begalka, Lederman, and Monroe and Representatives Craig, Campbell, Miller, Nelson, Russell, Schaefer, and Steele

- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to remove the requirement that fluoride be added to
- 2 municipal water supplies.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 34-24A-1 be repealed.
- 5 34-24A-1. Any person, firm, limited liability company, corporation, or municipality having
- 6 jurisdiction over a municipal water supply, whether publicly or privately owned or operated,
- 7 shall control the quantities of fluoride in the water so as to maintain a minimum fluoride content
- 8 prescribed by the South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources.
- 9 Section 2. That § 34-24A-1.1 be repealed.
- 10 34-24A-1.1. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall perform all the
- 11 functions of the Public Health Advisory Committee, the state health officer, and the Department
- 12 of Health with respect to water hygiene programs authorized under, but not limited to, this
- 13 chapter, except that the Board of Minerals and Environment shall perform any advisory
- 14 functions as defined in § 1-32-1.
- 15 Section 3. That § 34-24A-2 be repealed.

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- 1 34-24A-2. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall, in compliance with
- 2 chapter 1-26, promulgate rules relating to the fluoridation of public water supplies which shall
- 3 include, but not be limited to the following:
- 4 (1) The means by which fluoride is controlled;
- 5 (2) The methods of testing the fluoride content; and
- 6 (3) The records to be kept relating to fluoridation.
- 7 Section 4. That § 34-24A-3 be repealed.
- 8 34-24A-3. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall enforce the
- 9 provisions of §§ 34-24A-1 and 34-24A-2. In so doing it shall require the fluoridation of water
- in all municipal water supplies serving a population of five hundred or more. The department
- 11 may not require the fluoridation of water in any municipal water supply where such water
- supply in the state of nature contains sufficient fluorides to conform with the rules of the
- 13 department.
