 addressing child maltreatment.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That the code be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:
- A child advocacy center is a child-focused, trauma-informed, facility-based program that adheres to national best practice standards established by the national membership and accrediting body for children's advocacy centers, and in which representatives from law enforcement, child protection, prosecution, mental health, forensic interviewing, medical, and victim advocacy disciplines collaborate to evaluate children and make team decisions about the investigation, prosecution, safety, treatment, and support services for child maltreatment cases.
