Senate Bill 211

HOUSE ENGROSSED

This bill has been extensively amended (hoghoused) and may no longer be consistent with the original intention of the sponsor.

1 An Act to protect an individual's conscience from entities requiring the COVID-19 2 vaccine.

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 **Section 1.** <u>This Act shall be referred to as the COVID-19 Vaccine Freedom of Conscience Act.</u>
- 5 Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 34:
- 6 For the purpose of this Act, the term, conscience, means a person's inner conviction
- 7 <u>of what is right or wrong in the person's conduct.</u>

8 Section 3. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 34:

9 <u>A person has the right to be exempt from any COVID-19 vaccination mandate,</u>

10 requirement, obligation, or demand on the basis that receiving a COVID-19 vaccination

11 violates the person's conscience. A person may exercise the right to be exempt under this

12 Act orally or in writing.

13 Section 4. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 34:

- 14 No person may be subjected to any disciplinary action; being terminated, demoted,
- 15 or losing employment status in any way; loss of student status, including status in a
- 16 particular study program; nor may any person be denied access to any business premises
- 17 <u>as a result of the person's decision to decline to receive a COVID-19 vaccination on the</u>
- 18 <u>basis of conscience.</u>
- 19 Section 5. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 34:

20 Any entity or agent of any entity that mandates or requires any person to receive

21 <u>a COVID-19 vaccination or conditions any person's job or student status upon receiving a</u>

<u>COVID-19 vaccination must inform the person of the right to the conscience exemption</u>
 <u>under this Act.</u>

3 Section 6. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 34:

A civil action for damages or injunctive relief, or both, may be brought by any
 person for any violation of any provision of this Act. A person aggrieved by any violation
 of this Act who commences a civil action is entitled, upon the finding of a violation, to
 recover threefold the actual damages sustained, along with the costs of the action and
 reasonable attorney's fees.

9 Section 7. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 34:

A health care facility, as defined in § 34-12-1.1, is exempt from this Act during any
 period of time that compliance would result in a violation of regulations issued by the
 centers for medicare and medicaid services or the centers for disease control and
 prevention.

14 Section 8. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 34:

15 <u>This Act does not:</u>

16 (1) Apply to the South Dakota National Guard; and

- 17 (2) Prevent the South Dakota National Guard from requiring a COVID-19 immunization
- 18 <u>in compliance with a valid and lawful command order that applies to a</u>
 19 <u>servicemember who may be subject to federal activation.</u>
