1	FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require certain opportunity scholarship recipients to				
2	reside in South Dakota for five years following graduation from postsecondary education.				
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:				
4	Section 1. That § 13-55-31 be amended to read as follows:				
5	13-55-31. In order to be eligible for a South Dakota opportunity scholarship award, a student				
6	shall:				
7	(1)	Be a resident of South Dakota at the time of graduation from high school;			
8	(2)	Have a composite score of 24, or higher, on the test administered by the American			
9		College Testing Program or an equivalent score as determined by the Board of			
10		Regents on the Scholastic Assessment Test. The student shall take the ACT or SAT			
11		test before beginning postsecondary education;			
12	(3)	Meet the high school course requirements for graduation as provided in § 13-55-31.1;			
13	(4)	Attend a university, college, or technical school that is accredited by the North			
14		Central Association of Colleges and Schools and that provides instruction from a			
15		campus located in South Dakota; and			



1	(5)	Enter	into the program within five years of graduation from high school or within one	
2		year o	of the student's release from active duty with an active component of the armed	
3		forces	s if the release is within five years of the student's graduation from high school.	
4		If a st	udent attends full-time a regionally accredited university, college, or technical	
5		schoo	ol located outside South Dakota and within two years following high school	
6		gradu	ation or within two years following release from active military service returns	
7		to the	state to attend full-time a regionally accredited university, college, or technical	
8		schoo	ol, the student is eligible to receive a partial award; and	
9	<u>(6)</u>	For a	ny student seeking initial eligibility in school fiscal year 2015 or later:	
10		<u>(a)</u>	Agree, in writing, to reside in South Dakota for five years following	
11			graduation from an eligible institution unless the student leaves the state	
12			during that period of time to pursue graduate studies in another state or	
13			country; and	
14		<u>(b)</u>	Agree, through a promissory note, that failure to meet the provisions in	
15			subsection (a) will result in the scholarship being converted into an interest-	
16			bearing loan.	
17	A student is eligible to participate in the South Dakota opportunity scholarship program for			
18	the equivalent of four academic years (eight consecutive spring and fall terms) or until the			
19	attainment of a baccalaureate degree, whichever comes first. However, the executive director			
20	of the Board of Regents may grant exceptions to the continuous enrollment requirements for			
21	good cause shown.

A student who would have been eligible for the scholarship, but who applies after completing one or more semesters of full-time work at an accredited institution, may be admitted to the program only if the student has complied with the same grade point and credit hour requirements that would apply to program participants. Admission granted under these
circumstances may not be retroactive, and eligibility for participation in the program shall be
reduced by one semester for each semester of work completed prior to admission to the
program.
