## SENATE BILL NO. 35

Introduced by: The Committee on State Affairs at the request of the Department of Labor and Regulation

- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise and repeal provisions regarding revocation of
- 2 occupational licenses.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 36-16-13 be amended to read:
- 5 36-16-13. Any person, partnership, company, corporation, or association that for a fixed
- 6 sum, price, fee, percentage, or other consideration, undertakes or offers to undertake with
- 7 another to plan, lay out, supervise, install, make additions, make alterations, or make repairs,
- 8 in the installation of wiring, apparatus, or equipment for electric lights, heat, or power, shall
- 9 apply to be licensed by the State Electrical Commission for a license. A The commission shall
- 10 <u>issue a license shall be issued to a qualified person under this section</u> in the class specified in
- 11 <u>defined under</u> § 36-16-2 for which application has been made upon qualifying under this chapter
- and the rules of the commission and satisfactorily passing such examinations as shall be
- 13 required by the commission the person applies after successful completion of the examination
- 14 required by the commission.
- 15 The commission shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, establishing fees for the

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1 examination and the application required under this section. The commission may charge, or

- 2 may authorize a third party that administers the examination, to charge, each participant person
- an examination fee not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars per occurrence of examination or
- 4 reexamination. The application fee may not exceed fifty dollars per occurrence.
- 5 Each holder of or applicant for a license under this chapter shall notify the commission in
- 6 writing, within thirty days after its occurrence, of any issuance, denial, revocation, or suspension
- 7 of a certificate, license, or permit by another state, change of address or employment, or any
- 8 conviction of a felony.
- 9 Section 2. That § 36-16-33 be amended to read:
- 10 36-16-33. The State Electrical Commission may, in compliance accordance with chapter 1-
- 11 26, revoke a license at any time provided such registered person fails to perform the electrical
- work in accordance with the approved standards provided for in this chapter refuse to issue,
- 13 revoke, or suspend a license, or limit the scope of practice of any licensee for:
- 14 (1) Failure to comply with any law, or any rule or order of the commission;
- 15 (2) Failure to comply with the National Electric Code as adopted by rule of the
- 16 commission or local ordinance;
- 17 (3) Failure to notify the commission in writing within thirty days following any denial,
- 18 revocation, or suspension of a certificate, license, or permit issued by any other
- 19 <u>jurisdiction, or any change of address or employment;</u>
- 20 (4) Knowingly aiding and abetting any person who is not licensed in accordance with
- 21 this chapter to engage in activity that requires a license under § 36-16-13; or
- 22 (5) Conviction of or plea of guilty or nolo contendere to a crime of violence as defined
- 23 under § 22-1-2. For purposes of this subdivision, a certified copy of the record of
- conviction or plea of guilty or nolo contendere is conclusive evidence.

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- 1 Section 3. That § 36-25-19 be amended to read:
- 2 36-25-19. Application A person may apply for a license required by this chapter shall be
- 3 made to the commission, accompanied by the proper a license fee established by the
- 4 commission under this section. <del>Unless the applicant is entitled to a renewal, the applicant shall</del>
- 5 be registered by the If the person is not entitled to a renewal, the commission only after shall
- 6 <u>register a person who</u> satisfactorily <u>passing passes</u> an examination showing fitness to practice
- 7 the applicant's person's trade. Examinations may be held in conjunction with any quarterly
- 8 meeting of the commission.
- A license issued under this section expires on December thirty-first and may be renewed no
- 10 <u>later than the immediately following January thirty-first.</u>
- The commission may shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, to establish
- examination and reexamination fees, and license and renewal of license fees for: plumbing
- 13 contractor, plumber, water conditioning contractor, water conditioning installer, appliance
- 14 contractor, appliance installer, sewer and water contractor, sewer and water installer,
- 15 manufactured and mobile home contractor, manufactured and mobile home installer,
- underground irrigation contractor, and underground irrigation installer. No fee established under
- 17 this section for an examination or reexamination may exceed one hundred dollars. No fee
- 18 established under this section for a license or renewal of license may exceed three hundred
- 19 dollars.
- Section 4. That § 36-25-27 be amended to read:
- 21 36-25-27. The commission may, in accordance with chapter 1-26, refuse to issue, revoke the
- 22 permit of any person for a willful violation of any of the rules and regulations of the
- 23 commission, for violation of the State Plumbing Code, local ordinances applicable to plumbing
- 24 work, or for knowingly aiding or abetting any unlicensed person to do plumbing work where

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1 permits are required under this chapter, or suspend a license, or limit the scope of any license

- 2 <u>for:</u>
- 3 (1) Failure to comply with any law, or any rule or order of the commission;
- 4 (2) Failure to comply with local plumbing ordinances;
- 5 (3) Failure to notify the commission in writing within thirty days following any denial,
- 6 revocation, or suspension of a certificate, license, or permit issued by any other
- 7 jurisdiction, or any change of address or employment;
- 8 (4) Knowingly aiding and abetting any person who is not licensed in accordance with
- 9 this chapter to engage in activity that requires a license under this chapter; or
- 10 (5) Conviction of or plea of guilty or nolo contendere to a crime of violence as defined
- under § 22-1-2. For purposes of this subdivision, a certified copy of the record of
- 12 <u>conviction or plea of guilty or nolo contendere is conclusive evidence.</u>
- Section 5. That § 36-25-24.1 be amended to read:
- 36-25-24.1. As used in §§ 36-25-14, 36-25-19, <del>36-25-22,</del> and 36-25-24, the term,
- underground irrigation, refers to means any nonagricultural, landscape irrigation system.
- 16 Section 6. That § 36-16-13.1 be repealed.
- 17 36-16-13.1. An electrical contractor, Class B electrician, 501(d) electrician, or journeyman
- 18 electrician may not permit the use of his license by any other person or knowingly permit the
- 19 use thereof by another. A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.
- Section 7. That § 36-25-22 be repealed.
- 21 36-25-22. The commission shall register and issue a license to applicants who have
- 22 successfully qualified for such license under the provisions of this chapter and upon payment
- 23 of the fee herein provided. Each license expires December thirty-first of each year, but may be
- 24 renewed upon application made not later than the following January thirty-first.

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- The commission shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, to establish the initial
- 2 license fees and the renewal of license fees for: plumbing contractor, plumber, water
- 3 conditioning contractor, water conditioning installer, appliance contractor, appliance installer,
- 4 sewer and water contractor, sewer and water installer, manufactured and mobile home
- 5 contractor, manufactured and mobile home installer, underground irrigation contractor, and
- 6 underground irrigation installer. No fee may exceed three hundred dollars.
- 7 Section 8. That § 36-25-28 be repealed.
- 8 36-25-28. Before revoking any permit the commission shall comply with chapter 1-26.
