## HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS ENGROSSED NO. SB 54 - 03/09/2015

Introduced by: The Committee on Appropriations at the request of the Bureau of Finance and Management

- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding the state aid to special
- 2 education formula and to revise the property tax levies for special education.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 13-37-16 be amended to read as follows:
- 5 13-37-16. For taxes payable in <del>2015</del> 2016, and each year thereafter, the school board shall
- 6 levy no more than one dollar and forty-seven and eight forty and nine tenths cents per thousand
- 7 dollars of taxable valuation, as a special levy in addition to all other levies authorized by law
- 8 for the amount so determined to be necessary, and such levy shall be spread against all of the
- 9 taxable property of the district. The proceeds derived from such levy shall constitute a school
- district special education fund of the district for the payment of costs for the special education
- of all children in need of special education or special education and related services who reside
- within the district pursuant to the provisions of §§ 13-37-8.2 to 13-37-8.10, inclusive. The levy
- in this section shall be based on valuations such that the median level of assessment represents
- 14 85% of market value as determined by the Department of Revenue. The total amount of taxes

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that would be generated at the levy pursuant to this section shall be considered local effort.

- 2 Money in the special education fund may be expended for the purchase or lease of any assistive
- 3 technology that is directly related to special education and specified in a student's individualized
- 4 education plan. This section does not apply to real property improvements.
- 5 Section 2. That § 13-37-35.1 be amended to read as follows:
- 6 13-37-35.1. Terms used in chapter 13-37 mean:
- 7 (1) "Level one disability," a mild disability;
- 8 (2) "Level two disability," cognitive disability or emotional disorder;
- 9 (3) "Level three disability," hearing impairment, deafness, visual impairment, deaf-10 blindness, orthopedic impairment, or traumatic brain injury;
- 11 (4) "Level four disability," autism;
- 12 (5) "Level five disability," multiple disabilities;
- 13 (5A) "Level six disability," prolonged assistance;
- 14 (6) "Index factor," is the annual percentage change in the consumer price index for urban
  15 wage earners and clerical workers as computed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of
  16 the United States Department of Labor for the year before the year immediately
  17 preceding the year of adjustment or three percent, whichever is less;
- 18 (7) "Local effort," shall be calculated for taxes payable in 2015 2016 and thereafter using
  19 a special education levy of one dollar and twenty-seven and eight twenty and nine
  20 tenths cents per one thousand dollars of valuation;
- 21 (8) "Allocation for a student with a level one disability," for the school fiscal year
  22 beginning July 1, 2014 2015, is \$4,800.57 \$4,896.58. For each school year thereafter,
  23 the allocation for a student with a level one disability shall be the previous fiscal
  24 year's allocation for such child increased by the lesser of the index factor or three

- (9) "Allocation for a student with a level two disability," for the school fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 2015, is \$11,801.45 \$12,037.48. For each school year thereafter, the allocation for a student with a level two disability shall be the previous fiscal year's allocation for such child increased by the lesser of the index factor or three percent;
  - (10) "Allocation for a student with a level three disability," for the school fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 2015, is \$15,688.59 \$16,002.36. For each school year thereafter, the allocation for a student with a level three disability shall be the previous fiscal year's allocation for such child increased by the lesser of the index factor or three percent;
  - "Allocation for a student with a level four disability," for the school fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 2015, is \$14,008.12 \$14,288.28. For each school year thereafter, the allocation for a student with a level four disability shall be the previous fiscal year's allocation for such child increased by the lesser of the index factor or three percent;
  - "Allocation for a student with a level five disability," for the school fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 2015, is \$21,210.57 \$21,634.78. For each school year thereafter, the allocation for a student with a level five disability shall be the previous fiscal year's allocation for such child increased by the lesser of the index factor or three percent;
- (12A) "Allocation for a student with a level six disability," for the school fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 2015, is \$7,643.78 \$7,796.66. For each school year thereafter, the allocation for a student with a level six disability shall be the previous fiscal

1 year's allocation for such child increased by the lesser of the index factor or three 2 percent; 3 (13)"Child count," is the number of students in need of special education or special 4 education and related services according to criteria set forth in rules promulgated 5 pursuant to §§ 13-37-1.1 and 13-37-46 submitted to the Department of Education in 6 accordance with rules promulgated pursuant to § 13-37-1.1; 7 (14)"Fall enrollment," the number of kindergarten through twelfth grade pupils enrolled 8 in all schools operated by the school district on the last Friday of September of the 9 previous school year minus the number of students for whom the district receives 10 tuition, except any nonresident student who is in the care and custody of a state 11 agency and is attending a public school and any student for whom tuition is being 12 paid pursuant to § 13-28-42.1, plus the number of students for whom the district pays 13 tuition; 14 (15)"Nonpublic school," a sectarian organization or entity which is accredited by the 15 secretary of education for the purpose of instructing children of compulsory school 16 age. This definition excludes any school that receives a majority of its revenues from 17 public funds; 18 (16)"Nonpublic fall enrollment," until June 30, 2008, the number of children under age 19 sixteen, and beginning July 1, 2009, the number of children under age eighteen, who 20 are approved for alternative instruction pursuant to § 13-27-2 on the last Friday of 21 September of the previous school year plus: 22 (a) For nonpublic schools located within the boundaries of a public school district 23 with a fall enrollment of six hundred or more on the last Friday of September 24 of the previous school year, the number of kindergarten through twelfth grade

11		(a)	Multiply the special education fall enrollment by 0.1004 and multiply the
12			result by the allocation for a student with a level one disability;
13		(b)	Multiply the number of students having a level two disability as reported on
14			the child count for the previous school fiscal year by the allocation for a
15			student with a level two disability;
16		(c)	Multiply the number of students having a level three disability as reported on
17			the child count for the previous school fiscal year by the allocation for a
18			student with a level three disability;
19		(d)	Multiply the number of students having a level four disability as reported on
20			the child count for the previous school fiscal year by the allocation for a
21			student with a level four disability;
22		(e)	Multiply the number of students having a level five disability as reported on
23			the child count for the previous school fiscal year by the allocation for a
24			student with a level five disability;

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1		(f)	Multiply the number of students having a level six disability as reported on the
2			child count for the previous school fiscal year by the allocation for a student
3			with a level six disability;
4		(g)	When calculating local need at the statewide level, include the amount set
