- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding challenges to certain
- 2 election petition signatures.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 12-1-13 be amended to read as follows:
- 5 12-1-13. Within five business days after a nominating, initiative, or referendum petition is
- 6 filed with the person in charge of the election, any interested person who has researched the
- 7 signatures contained on the petition may file an affidavit stating that the petition contains
- 8 deficiencies as to the number of signatures from persons who are eligible to sign the petition.
- 9 The affidavit shall include an itemized listing of the specific deficiencies in question. Any
- 10 challenge to the certification or rejection of a nominating petition for a primary election made
- in circuit court shall be commenced no later than the second Tuesday in March. This action
- 12 takes precedence over other cases in circuit court. Any party appealing the circuit court order
- 13 to the Supreme Court shall file a notice of appeal within ten days of the date of the notice of the
- entry of the circuit court order. Any statewide initiated measure or referendum petition may be
- challenged by any person pursuant to this section by filing submitting an affidavit as set forth

1 above within thirty days after the petition is filed with the person in charge of the election.

- 2 Section 2. That § 12-1-14 be amended to read as follows:
- 3 12-1-14. The person in charge of the election shall verify the information contained in the
- 4 affidavit filed submitted pursuant to § 12-1-13 and make a written declaration regarding the
- 5 validity of the signatures in question. The person in charge of the election shall verify that each
- 6 person, challenged pursuant to § 12-1-13, was a registered voter at the time the person signed
- 7 the petition by using the registration documents on file in the office of the county auditor.
