SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Authorizes military and memorial license plates to be personalized. Requires payment of any other required fees and a fee to defray the cost of designing and manufacturing the personalized plates.

## FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

Increase State Revenue - \$52,500
Other Fiscal Impact - The Department of Revenue will retain approximately \$4,950 from the sale of 1,500 personalized license plates each year to compensate TRICOR for production costs. TRICOR will receive approximately $\$ 750$ in net revenue from the sale of every 1,500 license plates.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (004902): Adds language to the original bill to specify that the removal or redesign of any required legends or letters is not authorized by this legislation.

## FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

## Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- According to the Department of Revenue (DOR), there are approximately 66,055 memorial and 86,238 military plates currently issued for a total of 152,293 plates. This number is assumed to remain constant into perpetuity.
- It is reasonably assumed that at least 1,500 registrants (slightly less than one percent) will request personalized plates each year as a result of this legislation.
- Based on information provided by DOR, there is a personalization fee equal to $\$ 35$, which is charged annually for the plate, and the fee applicable to producing the license plate is estimated to be $\$ 3.30$ per plate, which is a one-time fee. Given that at least 1,500 registrants each year are assumed to request personalized plates, the total fee is estimated to be $\$ 38.30(\$ 35.00+\$ 3.30)$.
- The recurring increase in state revenue is estimated to be $\$ 57,450$ ( $\$ 38.30$ fee $\times 1,500$ plates). However, $\$ 4,950$ ( $\$ 3.30 \times 1,500$ plates) will be distributed to TRICOR to fund production of the personalized plates. The remaining $\$ 52,500$ ( $\$ 35 \times 1,500$ plates) will be deposited to the state General Fund.
