**SUMMARY OF BILL AS AMENDED (013738):** Enacts the “*Representative Mike Carter Act*”.

Requires, when arresting a person for stalking, aggravated stalking, especially aggravated stalking, various sexual offenses related to domestic abuse or violations of an order of protection, the arresting officer to provide the alleged victim with a document that notifies the alleged victim of information pertaining to laws governing the use of global positioning monitoring for such offenders and the victim’s rights pertaining to the use of those systems.

**FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL AS AMENDED:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-11-152(b), a magistrate may order a defendant who is arrested for the relevant offenses to carry or wear a global positioning monitoring system. The statute further prescribes various considerations, procedures, requirements, and rights of any victim of the offenses regarding the mandated use of such systems.
- The proposed legislation requires an arresting officer to provide this information to the alleged victim of any such offenses upon arresting the offender.
- It is assumed that state and local law enforcement officers can comply with this requirement in the normal course of business without a significant increase in state or local expenditures.
- Any fiscal impact to state or local government is estimated to be not significant.
