FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 2312 – SB 2333

April 2, 2018

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Prohibits state and local government officials or employees from accepting consular identification cards and other similar documents not authorized by the General Assembly for use for identification purposes, determining a person's identity, or residency.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (016442): Deletes all language after the enacting clause such that the substantive changes are to: (1) specify that state and local government officials are prohibited from accepting a consular card for the use in determining a person's identify or residency; (2) specify this legislation does not apply to local education agencies for purposes of student enrollment; and (3) specify that the prohibition is not applicable if acceptance of such documentation for identification purposes, determining a person's identity, or residency is required by federal law.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Based on information provided by the Departments of General Services, Safety, and Human Resources, any impact to departmental operations is estimated to be not significant.
- Based on information provided by the Secretary of State, this legislation will have no impact on elections.
- This legislation may require some local governments to rewrite current policies relating to accepted forms of identification; however, any fiscal impact to local government is estimated to be not significant.
