SUMMARY OF BILL: Prohibits any public funds, personnel, or property of this state, or of any political subdivision of this state, from being used for the implementation, regulation, or enforcement of any federal law, executive order, rule, or regulation regulating the ownership, use, or possession of chickens, if the expenditure of public funds or use of personnel or property would result in violation of another Tennessee statute, Tennessee common law, or the Constitution of Tennessee.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Based on information provided by the Department of Agriculture (DOA), the state does not currently enforce federal laws in regards to chickens; therefore, this legislation is estimated to have no significant impact on state government.
- To the extent known, there are no localities which currently enforce federal laws with regards to chickens; therefore, this legislation is estimated to have no significant impact on local government.
