SUMMARY OF BILL: Establishes that statutes governing rural electric cooperatives do not remove obligation from third-party contractors to comply with permitting requirements with respect to property that is held or controlled by a railroad company, while the third-party contractor is lawfully operating within a cooperative's service area.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption:

• Establishing that laws governing and regulating rural electric cooperatives do not alter or remove certain permitting obligations from entities lawfully operating within the cooperative's service area will not result in any significant fiscal impact to state or local government.

Assumption:

• This language codifies the existing practice of rural electric cooperatives; therefore it will not result in any significant impact to jobs or commerce within Tennessee.
