FISCAL NOTE

HB 10 - SB 7

January 11, 2021

SUMMARY OF BILL: Removes the provision that prevents various individuals to object to vaccinations, immunizations, or other medical procedures on the basis of religious tenets and practices during an epidemic or immediate threat thereof.

Removes the Class C misdemeanor for refusing to be vaccinated or preventing a person under such person's care and control from being vaccinated and the Class C misdemeanor for any physician who fraudulently gives a certificate of sickness or of vaccination to prevent vaccination.

Prohibits state agencies and political subdivisions of this state from promulgating, adopting, or enforcing any rule, ordinance, or resolution that requires medical examination, immunization, or treatment for those who object to the medical examination, immunization, or treatment on religious grounds or by right of conscience.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation will not significantly impact any programs or policies of state or local governments; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- Based on information provided by the Administrative Office of the Courts, there have been no dispositions for Tenn. Code Ann. § 68-5-106; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
