SUMMARY OF BILL: Establishes a two-year pilot project for litter removal from specific segments of state highway within Davidson County, effective from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2023.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed language:
 - o Applies to two specific portions of State Route 265 within Davidson County;
 - o Requires litter to be removed from the specified areas at least once per month;
 - Establishes two methods for the removal of the litter: (1) the Tennessee
 Department of Transportation (TDOT) removes the litter and is reimbursed by
 Davidson County; or (2) Davidson County removes the litter; and
 - o Requires Davidson County to set aside five percent of litter grants received pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 57-5-201(a)(2) and § 67-4-402(b)(2) for the purposes of reimbursing TDOT for litter removal.
- Davidson County has received \$179,800 in each of the previous three fiscal years in litter grants and conducts regular litter pickup at the specified locations on State Route 265. Davidson County's litter grant award is assumed to remain constant throughout the two-year pilot project.
- Expenditures associated with litter removal, experienced either by TDOT or Davidson County, will be offset in an equal, corresponding amount of funding from Davidson County's litter grant award; therefore, any fiscal impact to state and local government is estimated to be not significant.
