

HOUSE BILL 613

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102, relative to consumption of alcoholic beverages in certain premier type tourist resorts in any county having a population of not less than twenty nine thousand eight hundred (29,800) nor more than twenty nine thousand nine hundred (29,900) according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102(26), is amended by adding the following as a new subdivision thereto:

( ) A commercially operated recreational facility whether open to the public or limited to members and guests of an association or of the development on which it is located, owned, and operated by an association or corporation and in connection with an eighteen-hole golf course which facility is regularly kept, used, and maintained as a place where meals are actually and regularly served, with adequate and sanitary kitchen facilities, and which facility meets all the following characteristics:

(i) The facility must have a clubhouse with no less than six thousand (6,000) enclosed square feet;

(ii) The facility must be located within the limits of a development that is within five hundred (500) yards of a water reservoir operated and maintained by the United States army corps of engineers during 1998 or any subsequent years;

(iii) The facility must be located within at least three (3) miles of an airport with lighted runway of at least three thousand feet (3000') in length;

(iv) Maintenance within the recreational area of the following types of recreational facilities:

(a) Golf course of at least eighteen (18) holes;

(b) Swimming pool; and

(c) Tennis court; and

(v) The facility is located within a county having a population of not less than twenty nine thousand eight hundred (29,800) nor more than twenty nine thousand nine hundred (29,900), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
