

HOUSE BILL 1810

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4 and
Title 12, Chapter 2, relative to the disposal of
state-owned property.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 12-2-112(a)(3), is amended by
deleting the following language:

As used in this subdivision (a)(3), "public auction" may include, without limitation,
Internet auctions and in-person auctions so long as such auctions are open for
participation by the public at large.

and substituting instead the following:

As used in this subdivision (a)(3), "public auction" may include, without limitation,
Internet auctions and in-person auctions; provided, that such in-person auctions shall be
open for participation by the public at large and conducted by an auctioneer licensed by
the Tennessee auctioneer commission.

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 12-2-112, is amended by adding the
following language as a new subsection:

() A public auction shall be the method used to dispose of state-owned real or
personal property. The auction shall be conducted by an auctioneer licensed by the
Tennessee auctioneer commission; provided, that the auctioneer shall be selected
through a competitive bid or solicitation process as determined by the procurement office
of each respective state agency.

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 12-2-403(a), is amended by deleting
the subdivision and substituting instead:

(a) An article of state-owned real or personal property shall be disposed of as surplus property by a public auction to be conducted by an auctioneer licensed by the Tennessee auctioneer commission, publicly advertised and held; provided, that the auctioneer shall be selected through a competitive bid or solicitation as determined by the procurement office of each respective state agency;

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016, and shall apply to all state-owned property disposed of on or after the effective date of this act, the public welfare requiring it.
