AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 55, Chapter 21, Part 1, relative to the Disabled Drivers Law of 1975.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-21-102(3)(A), is amended by deleting the language "confine the person to a wheelchair" and substituting instead the language "require the use of a wheelchair", and deleting the language ", arthritics, spastics".

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-21-103(a)(2), is amended by deleting the language "who are permanently and totally confined to a wheelchair" and substituting instead the language "who use a wheelchair because of a permanent incapacity for ambulation".

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-21-103(a)(3), is amended by deleting the language "is permanently and totally confined to a wheelchair" and substituting instead the language "uses a wheelchair because of a permanent incapacity for ambulation".

SECTION 4. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-21-103(a)(5), is amended by deleting the language "is permanently and totally confined to a wheelchair" and substituting instead the language "uses a wheelchair because of a permanent incapacity for ambulation".

SECTION 5. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-21-103(b)(2)(B)(ii), is amended by deleting the language "who is permanently confined to a wheelchair" and substituting instead the language "who uses a wheelchair because of a permanent incapacity for ambulation".


SECTION 6. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-21-103(f)(1), is amended by deleting the language "person permanently confined to a wheelchair" and substituting instead the language "person who uses a wheelchair because of a permanent incapacity for ambulation".

SECTION 7. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-21-108(a)(3), is amended by deleting the language "a person confined to a wheelchair" and substituting instead the language "a person using a wheelchair".

SECTION 8. This act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
