AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 67, Chapter 3 and Title 67, Chapter 6, relative to taxation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-3-901(g), is amended by deleting the language "an amount equal to five thousand three hundred forty-four ten-thousandths of one percent (0.5344%)" and substituting instead the language "an amount equal to eighty-eight one-hundredths of one percent (0.88%)".

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-3-901(g), is amended by adding the following at the end of the subsection:

In addition to any other purposes authorized by law for which such funds may be used, the funds apportioned pursuant to this subsection (g) must also be used for public and environmental infrastructure at marinas.

SECTION 3. This act takes effect July 1, 2022, the public welfare requiring it.

On April 27, 2022, the Senate of the One Hundred Twelfth General Assembly passed Senate Bill No. 2078 by a constitutional majority. On April 27, 2022, the House of Representatives of the One Hundred Twelfth General Assembly passed Senate Bill No. 2078 by a constitutional majority. Thereupon, the Bill was transmitted to and received by the Governor on May 18, 2022. The Governor returned the Bill on May 27, 2022, without his signature.

As the Governor did not return Senate Bill No. 2078 with his disapproval within ten (10) calendar days, excluding Sundays, after he received the Bill, Senate Bill No. 2078 becomes law without the Governor's signature pursuant to Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of the State of Tennessee.
