

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 543

A RESOLUTION to commemorate April 2023 as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Tennessee.

WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect are societal problems that affect nearly every community within our State and nation; and

WHEREAS, sadly, the number of abused or neglected children continues to increase every year; child abuse and neglect include physical, sexual, and emotional abuse and physical neglect, all of which may be the result of a multiplicity of such social problems as family dysfunction, mental health problems, substance abuse, inadequate parenting skills, teen pregnancy, homelessness, family violence, crime, and poverty; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should pause to recognize the intense problem of child abuse and the lasting effects it has on Tennessee's most precious resource—our children; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of community and State leadership to raise awareness of child abuse and neglect and to establish prevention and support mechanisms for children and parents in order to stop the cycle of abuse that destroys the lives of those affected; and

WHEREAS, the designation of April 2023 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" is an effort to raise awareness of child abuse and to encourage communities throughout our State to create partnerships among social service agencies, schools, religious organizations, law enforcement agencies, and the business community and to become involved in supporting parents in raising their children in a safe, nurturing environment; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE CONCURRING, that we join with our fellow citizens as they commemorate April 2023 as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Tennessee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an appropriate copy of this resolution be prepared for presentation with this final clause omitted from such copy and upon proper request made to the appropriate clerk, the language appearing immediately following the State seal appear without House or Senate designation.
