Amos, and during her formative years, she served in the children's choir and as secretary of the Epworth League and Sunday School, and she regularly attended Vacation Bible School; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Tate has been a delegate to a number of Church conferences that have been held in and out of Tennessee and most recently has been involved with the Mass Choir and the Pisgah Performers and served as chairlady for Women's Day, chairlady and co-chairlady of the Decorating Committee, Sunday School secretary, member of the William Davis Sunday School Class, Bible Study participant, past B.R. Danner Club vice president, and member of the Higher Education Ministry; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Tate is considered one of the historians for the Orange Mound community and is featured in several documentaries and a movie concerning Orange Mound; and

WHEREAS, devoted to her family, Juanita Tate enjoyed many years of marriage with her husband, Herbert C. Tate, Sr., until his passing, and she treasures the love and support of their four children; and

WHEREAS, Juanita Tate epitomizes the spirit and commitment to family and community that are characteristic of a true Tennessean; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the members of this General Assembly acknowledge and applaud Juanita Tate for her dedication to the State of Tennessee and its citizens; now, therefore.
