#### Abstract

A RESOLUTION to recognize the innovative stewardship and cooperative spirit of Marion County's elected officials and appointed entities.

WHEREAS, the aforementioned entities have a vision for combining resources in a safe, comprehensive solution; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED ELEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE CONCURRING, that we recognize and congratulate the Marion County School District, the Marion County Commission, and the Marion County Library Board of Trustees on exploring and studying the potential of leading the State with options for combining library resources to provide
a $21^{\text {st }}$ century library, which collaborative project could serve as a template to help other municipalities in Tennessee construct, maintain, and operate tomorrow's libraries today.
