WHEREAS, it is imperative that there be greater public awareness of this serious issue, and more must be done to increase activity at the local, state, and national levels; and

WHEREAS, this resolution will inspire a necessary discussion in our State on how we can harness our resources to reduce gun violence to improve our State's programs in prevention, intervention, education, and outreach; and

WHEREAS, increased awareness and coordination among all stakeholders is critical to the prevention of gun violence, the equal protection of our citizens, and to ensure our State's safety for our youth; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE CONCURRING, that we hereby join with the members of the Gun Violence Awareness Partnership as they commemorate June 2014 as "Gun Violence Awareness Month".
