A RESOLUTION to recognize Van D. Turner, Jr., Third Annual Living Legend Awards honoree.

WHEREAS, one such individual is Van D. Turner, Jr., who is being honored at the Third Annual Living Legend Awards in recognition of the leadership and service he has provided to the people of Shelby County; and

WHEREAS, his many professional accomplishments aside, Mr. Turner is grateful for the love and support he shares with his wife, Tamara Turner, and their three children, Malik, Masai, and Malia; and

WHEREAS, Van Turner is an exemplary individual; his commitment to excellence and community service is representative of the Volunteer State, and he should be specially recognized; now, therefore,
