HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 912

A RESOLUTION to confirm the appointment of Jeremy Nagoshiner of Nashville to the Heritage Conservation Trust Fund Board.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 11-7-104(a), provides for the creation of the Heritage Conservation Trust Fund Board; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 11-7-104(b), provides that the Governor shall appoint eleven members to the board; and

WHEREAS, Governor Bill Lee has appointed Jeremy Nagoshiner of Nashville as a member of the Heritage Conservation Trust Fund Board representing Middle Tennessee, to a term that will expire on October 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the former senior public policy advisor at Baker Donelson's Nashville office,
