

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 1318

A RESOLUTION to create a special joint committee to study certain issues relative to all terrain vehicles.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE CONCURRING, that there is hereby created a special joint committee to study the operation of all terrain vehicles on certain roads, streets, and highways for the purpose of acquiring fuel, food, or shelter or for adventure tourism purposes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee shall consist of three (3) members of the House of Representatives and three (3) members of the Senate, to be appointed by the respective speakers. In addition to the six (6) members appointed by the speakers, the prime House sponsor and the prime Senate sponsor of Senate Bill 957/House Bill 1324 of the One Hundred Sixth General Assembly shall serve as co-chairs of the committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all appropriate state agencies shall provide assistance to the special joint committee upon request of the co-chairs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all legislative members of the special joint committee who are duly elected members of the General Assembly shall remain members of such committee until the committee reports its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the special joint committee shall be convened by the co-chairs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the special joint committee shall timely report its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the One Hundred Seventh

General Assembly no later than February 1, 2011, at which time the committee shall cease to exist.
