

## HOUSE RESOLUTION 42

A RESOLUTION to honor the service and sacrifice of our canine veterans.

WHEREAS, from time to time, the members of this General Assembly pause in their deliberations to recognize those who have contributed greatly in service to this State and to these United States; and

WHEREAS, this recognition extends to those canines who have dedicated their lives to serving and protecting our soldiers, our citizens, and our borders; and

WHEREAS, all four branches of the United States Armed Forces as well as other government agencies, including the Secret Service, Central Intelligence Agency, Transportation Security Authority, and civilian contractors working in conjunction with these agencies, use military working dogs in service to the country; and

WHEREAS, dogs have not only helped win battles and save lives, but also have had an enormous beneficial effect upon the mental well-being of those humans with whom they served; and

WHEREAS, in addition to their service to the military, dogs have also been invaluable in border protection, police work, and search and rescue operations; and

WHEREAS, specially trained dogs are currently deployed in theater as combat stress-relief canines and used in therapeutic rehabilitation settings and service to wounded service members and veterans; and

WHEREAS, dogs have abilities that the most advanced technology cannot match and have performed with bravery and honor for many years, rendering them invaluable; and

WHEREAS, their service is carried out with incredible efficiency and dedication and is an important contribution to the security and public safety of our State and Nation; and

WHEREAS, remembrance of all the dogs from all our wars is in keeping with the “K-9 Veterans Day” movement, founded by the late Joseph J. White; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, that we hereby formally honor the many contributions made by Canine Veterans throughout the history of these United States and commend them for their steadfast and loyal service.
