A RESOLUTION to honor James Wattenbarger on receiving the National Wild Turkey Federation's Overall Volunteer of the Year Award.

WHEREAS, Mr. Wattenbarger now pursues his special interest in introducing young people to the outdoors by serving as the state JAKES coordinator for Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, during the past two years, he has assisted five NWTF chapters in starting JAKES programs and has helped increase membership statewide; and

WHEREAS, although he modestly describes this prestigious award as a "team effort," Mr. Wattenbarger's fellow NWTF members value his "complete commitment" and admire him as a problem solver who works tirelessly to involve more youth, women, and people with disabilities in NWTF's hunting heritage programs; and

WHEREAS, James Wattenbarger is a Tennessean who has distinguished himself as an exceptional Volunteer, and he should be recognized for his dedication to the National Wild Turkey Federation and its worthy mission of conserving upland wildlife habitat across North America; now, therefore,
