

SENATE BILL 1014

AN ACT amend Tennessee Code Annotated, relative to
the protection of private property rights.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. The state of Tennessee or any political subdivision of the state shall not adopt or implement any policy recommendation that intentionally or inadvertently infringes upon or restricts private property rights without due process of law even if required by recommendations originating in or traceable to a policy statement for sustainable development adopted in 1992 at the Conference on Environment and Development by an organization composed of representatives of multiple nations or any other international law or plan of action that contravenes the Constitution of the United States or the Constitution of Tennessee.

SECTION 2. Because organizations composed of representatives of multiple nations enlists and accredits numerous non-governmental and inter-governmental organizations to assist in the implementation of polices such as for sustainable development, the state of Tennessee or any political subdivision of the state shall not enter into any agreement, expend any sum of money, or receive funds contracting services, or give financial aid to or from any non-governmental and inter-governmental organization engaging in such policy implementation.

SECTION 3. Any existing statute, ordinance, rule, regulation or other similar agreement in contract with this act are repealed and void. No contract in conflict with this act shall be entered into or renewed on or after its effective date.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
