## SENATE BILL 1750

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 39, Chapter 17, relative to criminal offenses.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 3, is amended by adding the following language as a new section:

- (a) A person commits an offense who, with intent to conceal the person's identity, wears a mask, hood, or device by which a portion of the person's face is so hidden, concealed, or covered so as to conceal the identity of the person while the person is on a public way, public property, or the private property of another without the written permission of the property owner or the occupier of the property to do so.
  - (b) It is not an offense under this section to:
    - (1) Wear a traditional holiday costume on the occasion of the holiday;
  - (2) Lawfully engage in a trade, profession, occupation, or sporting activity where a mask, hood, or device is worn for the purpose of ensuring the physical safety of the wearer or others, or because of the nature of the trade, profession, occupation, or sporting activity;
  - (3) Wear a mask, hood, or device while engaged in a theatrical production, parade, or masquerade ball; or
  - (4) Wear a gas mask prescribed in emergency management drills or emergencies.
  - (c) A violation of this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020, the public welfare requiring it.
