## SENATE BILL 1799

## By Southerland

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 68, Chapter 211 and Title 68, Chapter 213, relative to solid waste disposal.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 68, Chapter 211, Part 1, is amended by adding the following language as a new section:

68-211-125.

- (a) No owner or operator of a sanitary landfill that is located within a twenty-five (25) mile radius of a site where asphalt roofing shingles are recycled pursuant to a permit-by-rule issued in accordance with this chapter and rules promulgated by the board shall accept, for disposal, loads of whole or processed asphalt roofing shingles.
- (b) The board shall prominently post on its web site the name and address of each site at which the recycling of asphalt roofing shingles is approved pursuant to the issuance of a permit-by-rule.

(c)

- (1) No later than January 31, of each year, each recipient of a permit-by-rule for recycling asphalt roofing shingles shall submit a report to the board that contains the following information:
  - (A) The total quantity of asphalt roofing shingles received under the permit-by-rule during the previous calendar year;
  - (B) The beneficial uses during the previous calendar year of shingles received under the permit-by-rule;

- (C) The total quantity of shingles used in each beneficial use during the previous calendar year; and
- (D) The total quantity and disposition of any shingles received but not beneficially used under the permit-by-rule during the previous calendar year.
- (2) The report shall be submitted on a form prescribed by the board.
- (d) This section shall be repealed on February 1, 2020.

SECTION 2. The underground storage tanks and solid waste disposal control board is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act, compiled in title 4, chapter 5, to effectuate the purposes of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014, the public welfare requiring it.
