## PUBLIC CHAPTER NO. 865

### SENATE BILL NO. 2506

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 57 and Title 62, relative to alcoholic beverages.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-101(a), is amended by adding the following new subdivision:

(23) Restricted retail business, as defined in § 57-4-102, to the patrons of such restricted small business, subject to this chapter.

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102, is amended by adding the following new subdivision:

( ) "Restricted retail business" means a retail business that:

(A) Is:

(i) A barbershop licensed by the board of cosmetology and barbering;

(ii) A cosmetology shop licensed by the board of cosmetology and barbering; or

(iii) A cigar bar;

(B) Provides food service for patrons;

(C) Has no more than twenty (20) seats for food service for patrons; and

(D) Sells alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises in an amount the sales from which do not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the retail business's annual gross sales;

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-203(d), is amended by adding the following new subdivision:

(7) A restricted retail business licensed under § 57-4-102( ) shall not sell or give away alcoholic beverages, malt beverages, or wine between the hours of ten o'clock p.m. (10:00 p.m.) and eight o'clock a.m. (8:00 a.m.).

SECTION 4. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-301(b)(1), is amended by adding the following new subdivision:

(Y) Restricted retail business.....\$2,000

SECTION 5. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-201(b)(1), is amended by adding the language "restricted retail business," between the language "food hall," and "club,".

SECTION 6. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 62-4-127(b)(4), is amended by deleting the subdivision and substituting instead the following:

(4) The sale or distribution of wine, beer, liquor, or any alcoholic beverages or drugs on the premises of a cosmetology, manicuring, or aesthetics establishment that is not licensed as a restricted retail business, as defined in § 57-4-102, by the Tennessee alcoholic beverage commission is prohibited; provided, that wine, beer, liquor, or alcoholic beverages may be served to a patron without a charge, but no such beverages may be served to a patron who is intoxicated or believed to be intoxicated;

SECTION 7. This act takes effect July 1, 2024, the public welfare requiring it.
