## **PRIVATE CHAPTER NO. 45**

**SENATE BILL NO. 2977**

AN ACT to amend Chapter 6 of the Private Acts of 1953; and any other acts amendatory thereto, relative to the charter for the Town of Enville.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the Private Acts of 1953, and any other acts amendatory thereto, is amended in the third paragraph of Section 5 by deleting the language "a sum not to exceed Two (\$2.00) Dollars each per month" and substituting the language ", for the Mayor's salary, a sum not to exceed one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200) per month".

SECTION 2. Chapter 6 of the Private Acts of 1953, and any other acts amendatory thereto, is amended in the last paragraph of Section 5 by deleting the language "the first Friday night of the following month after assuming office, and each first Friday night of each month thereafter," and substituting the language "on a regularly scheduled monthly date, as determined by the Board,".

SECTION 3. Chapter 6 of the Private Acts of 1953, and any other acts amendatory thereto, is amended in Section 16 by deleting the language "and those who do not live within the corporate limits of the said municipality, but own real estate or stock in any corporation, the situs of which is in the corporate limits of said municipality, at a value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, which is in the corporate limits of the said municipality".

SECTION 4. Nothing in this act shall be construed to alter the salary of any incumbent prior to the end of the term for which such elected official was selected, as prescribed in Article XI, Section 9 of the Constitution of the State of Tennessee.

SECTION 5. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the legislative body of the Town of Enville. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the legislative body and certified to the secretary of state.

SECTION 6. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it is effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it becomes effective as provided in Section 5.
