## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 57

WHEREAS, he received his bachelor's degree in business administration from Union University in Jackson and is a graduate of the University of Tennessee Certified Public Administrator program and the Nashville Auction School, as well as University of Tennessee at Martin WestStar, Leadership McNairy County, AgStar, Tennessee Government Executive Institute, and Delta Regional Authority Leadership Institute professional development programs; and

WHEREAS, a sixth-generation farmer himself, Commissioner Templeton has produced grain, cotton, hay, cattle, and timber in McNairy and Hardin counties; he currently resides on his family farm in Stantonville; and

WHEREAS, a man of devout faith, Commissioner Templeton is a member of First Baptist Church of Adamsville and Gideon's International; and

WHEREAS, Jai Templeton enjoys the love and support of his wife, Allison, and their three children, Canon Smith, Eliza Smith, and Mycaela Rhodes; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Templeton is wholly committed to the noble precepts of public service that have earned Tennessee recognition as the Volunteer State, and he should be specially recognized; now, therefore,
