WHEREAS, this remarkable lady is survived by her loving husband, Ajibade Ibitoye; her son and our colleague, Olajide Ibitoye; and her daughter, Olayinka Ibitoye; and WHEREAS, during these sad and tragic times, let us rededicate ourselves to conquering COVID-19 through vaccination and education, as we pay tribute to Mrs. Ibitoye's legacy as a gifted and compassionate medical professional and a loving wife and mother; now, therefore,
