WHEREAS, one such individual is Henry Brooks, who recently garnered a gold medal in the Computer Numeric Control (CNC) Programmer category at the SkillsUSA national championship in Atlanta, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, a student at the Tennessee College of Applied Technology Greene Technology Center, Mr. Brooks claimed victory in the state-level CNC Programmer competition before besting champions from all other states in national competition; and

WHEREAS, prior to his collegiate victory, Mr. Brooks won the state-level competition in the CNC Programmer category his senior year; as a home-schooled student, he studied machine tool technology at Greene Technology Center for eight semesters, while also earning eight credit hours at Northeast State Community College in machine tool studies and more than 400 hours of dual enrollment with TCAT Morristown; and WHEREAS, he has earned two National Institute of Metalworking Skills industry certifications and six Precision Measuring Instruments industry certifications through the National Coalition of Certification Centers; and

WHEREAS, Henry Brooks's display of aptitude and ambition surely bodes well for his future success, and his dedication to excellence is clearly deserving of our respect, admiration, and commendation; now, therefore,
