

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 7100

A RESOLUTION to honor and commend the Johnson County Senior Center for receiving national accreditation from the National Council on Aging.

WHEREAS, after a lengthy process, the work of Ms. Kathy Motsinger-Eller, Director of the Johnson County Senior Center and her staff, and the overwhelming support of their community, the Johnson County Senior Center received its official national accreditation from the National Council on Aging (NCOA) in a special ceremony held in Washington, D.C., this past June; and

WHEREAS, the Johnson County Senior Center hopes to continue to grow its service outreach to area seniors and continue to have a positive impact on Johnson County as it believes in the strength of a kind, caring community; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that we recognize this exemplary organization on this special occasion; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that we honor the Johnson County Senior Center on earning its official national accreditation from the National Council on Aging and commend its

administration and staff for their service to the residents of Johnson County, extending to them our best wishes for continued success in all future endeavors.
