

SENATE RESOLUTION 174

A RESOLUTION to celebrate International Maternal Health and Rights Day.

WHEREAS, April 11 is annually observed as International Maternal Health and Rights Day to celebrate every person's right to respectful, quality, safe, and comprehensive maternal health care; and

WHEREAS, approximately fifteen percent of all pregnancies worldwide are affected by life-threatening but preventable complications; adolescents are at significant risk for maternal complications, with maternal deaths ranking as a leading cause of death for girls aged fifteen to nineteen; and

WHEREAS, women need integrated, evidence-based, and cost-effective care before, during, and after pregnancy, as women die from complications in pregnancy or childbirth because their nation's health system lacks resources and/or their allocation of health resources overlooks women's needs; and

WHEREAS, sadly, the United States has the highest maternal mortality rate of any developed country according to the latest reports, with a maternal mortality rate of 17.4 deaths per 100,000 births; and

WHEREAS, in Tennessee, the maternal mortality rate is even higher with 26.7 deaths per 100,000 births; and

WHEREAS, International Maternal Health and Rights Day seeks to raise awareness of the importance of maternal health and promote skilled and dignified care for women around the world; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED TWELFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, that we join with our fellow citizens in the celebration of April 11, 2022, as International Maternal Health and Rights Day in Tennessee.
