A BILL

- To direct the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to establish a grant program to improve the ability of trauma center hospitals and airports to withstand earthquakes, and for other purposes.

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Critical Infrastructure
- 5 Earthquake Preparedness Act of 2011".

1SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAM TO ASSIST TRAUMA CENTER HOS-2PITALS AND AIRPORTS TO WITHSTAND3EARTHQUAKES.

4 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—Not later than 180 days after 5 the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of 6 the Federal Emergency Management Agency shall estab-7 lish a program under which the Administrator is author-8 ized to make grants to State and local governments to as-9 sist projects that improve the ability to withstand an 10 earthquake of one or both of the following facilities:

11 (1) A trauma center hospital in a hazardous12 seismic zone.

13 (2) An airport in a hazardous seismic zone.

(b) GRANT PRIORITIES.—In making a grant under
subsection (a), the Administrator shall consider, with respect to a proposed project, the following:

17 (1) The vulnerability to an earthquake of the18 facility to be improved.

19 (2) The size of the population served by the fa-20 cility to be improved.

21 (3) The availability of similar facilities in the22 area surrounding the facility to be improved.

(4) The ability to withstand an earthquake of
the facility to be improved, if the proposed project
is not carried out.

 (5) The ability of the proposed project to be carried out without Federal assistance. (c) FEDERAL SHARE.— (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in paragraph (2), the Federal share of the cost of a project carried out using grant funds made available under subsection (a) may not exceed 90 percent. (2) EXCEPTION.—The Administrator may treat, with respect to a project, the percentage specified in paragraph (1) as 100 percent, if— (A) the Administrator determines there is substantial need for the project; and (B) the Administrator determines that the project will not otherwise be carried out.
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(d) Comprehensive Strategic Response
PLAN.—The Administrator shall require each State and
local government that receives a grant under subsection
(a), as a condition of the grant, to submit to the Adminis-
trator a comprehensive strategic earthquake response plan
for the facility with respect to which the grant was made.
Each State and local government may use not more than
5 percent of grant funds made available under subsection
(a) to meet the requirement of this subsection.
(e) Report on Use of Grant Funds.—The Ad-

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that receives a grant under subsection (a), as a condition 1 2 of the grant, to submit to the Administrator each fiscal 3 year during which grant funds are received a report that— 4 (1) lists and describes the activities carried out 5 using grant funds; and 6 (2) describes and analyzes the impact of the ac-7 tivities. 8 (f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the following defi-9 nitions apply: 10 (1) AIRPORT.—The term "airport" has the 11 meaning given that term under section 47102(2) of 12 title 49, United States Code, except that the term is 13 limited to airports located in the United States. 14 HAZARDOUS SEISMIC ZONE.—The term (2)"hazardous seismic zone" means an area determined 15 16 by the Administrator, in consultation with the Direc-17 tor of the United States Geological Survey, to have 18 a high probability of experiencing a severe earth-19 quake. 20 TRAUMA CENTER HOSPITAL.—The term (3)"trauma center hospital" means a medical facility 21 22 determined by the Administrator, in consultation 23 with the Secretary of Health and Human Services, 24 to---

1	(A) provide surgical care to trauma pa-
2	tients;
3	(B) be located in the United States;
4	(C) be obligated to treat all patients with-
5	out regard to ability to pay; and
6	(D) provide care to more than 2,000 indi-
7	viduals admitted for shock trauma each year.
8	(g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
9	are authorized to be appropriated to the Administrator to
10	carry out this section such sums as may be necessary.

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
