A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to provide for arthritis research and public health, and for other purposes.

3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.				
4	This Act may be cited as the "Arthritis Prevention,				
5	Control, and Cure Act of 2010".				
6	SEC. 2. ENHANCING PUBLIC HEALTH ACTIVITIES RELATED				
7	7 TO ARTHRITIS THROUGH THE NATIONAL A				
8	THRITIS ACTION PLAN.				
9	Part B of title III of the Public Health Service Act				
10	(42 U.S.C. 243 et seq.) is amended by inserting after section				
11	314 the following:				
12	"SEC. 315. NATIONAL ARTHRITIS ACTION PLAN.				
13	"(a) Establishment of Plan.—The Secretary may				
14	develop and implement a National Arthritis Action Plan				
15	(in this section referred to as the 'Plan') consistent with				
16	this section.				
17	"(b) Control, Prevention, and Surveillance.—				
18	"(1) In General.—Under the Plan, the Sec-				
19	retary may, directly or through competitive grants to				
20	eligible entities, conduct, support, and promote the co-				
21	ordination of research, investigations, demonstrations,				
22	training, and studies relating to the control, preven-				
23	tion, and surveillance of arthritis and other rheu-				
24	matic diseases.				
25	"(2) Training and technical assistance.—				

"(A) Provision.—Upon the request of an 1 2 applicant receiving a grant under paragraph 3 (1), the Secretary may, subject to subparagraph 4 (B), provide training, technical assistance, sup-5 plies, equipment, or services for the purpose of 6 aiding the applicant in carrying out grant ac-7 tivities and, for such purpose, may detail to the 8 applicant any officer or employee of the Depart-9 ment of Health and Human Services.

> "(B) Corresponding reduction in Pay-Ments.—With respect to a request described in subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall reduce the amount of payments under the grant under paragraph (1) to the applicant involved by an amount equal to the costs of detailing personnel (including pay, allowances, and travel expenses) and the fair market value of any supplies, equipment, or services provided by the Secretary.

"(3) ARTHRITIS PREVENTION RESEARCH AT THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.—
The Secretary may provide additional grant support under this subsection to encourage the expansion of research related to the prevention and management of arthritis at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

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"(4) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—For purposes of this subsection, the term 'eligible entity' means a public or private nonprofit entity that demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Secretary, in the application described in subsection (e), the ability of the entity to carry out the activities described in paragraph (1).

"(c) Education and Outreach.—

- "(1) In General.—Under the Plan, the Secretary may coordinate and carry out national education and outreach activities, directly or through the provision of grants to eligible entities, to support, develop, and implement education initiatives and outreach strategies appropriate for arthritis and other rheumatic diseases.
- "(2) Initiatives and strategies implemented under paragraph (1) may include public awareness campaigns, public service announcements, and community partnership workshops, as well as programs targeted to businesses and employers, managed care organizations, and health care providers.
- "(3) Priority.—In carrying out paragraph (1), the Secretary—
- 24 "(A) may emphasize prevention, early diag-25 nosis, and appropriate management of arthritis,

1	and opportunities for effective patient self-man-
2	agement; and
3	"(B) may give priority to reaching high-
4	risk or underserved populations.
5	"(4) Collaboration.—In carrying out this sub-
6	section, the Secretary shall consult and collaborate
7	with stakeholders from the public, private, and non-
8	profit sectors with expertise relating to arthritis con-
9	trol, prevention, and treatment.
10	"(5) Eligible entity.—For purposes of this
11	subsection, the term 'eligible entity' means a public or
12	private nonprofit entity that demonstrates to the sat-
13	isfaction of the Secretary, in the application described
14	in subsection (e), the ability of the entity to carry out
15	the activities described in paragraph (1).
16	"(d) Comprehensive State Grants.—
17	"(1) In General.—Under the Plan, the Sec-
18	retary may award grants to eligible entities to pro-
19	vide support for comprehensive arthritis control and
20	prevention programs and to enable such entities to
21	provide public health surveillance, prevention, and
22	control activities related to arthritis and other rheu-
23	matic diseases.
24	"(2) Application.—The Secretary may only
25	award a grant under this subsection to an eligible en-

1	tity that submits to the Secretary an application at
2	such time, in such manner, and containing such
3	agreements, assurances, and information as the Sec-
4	retary may require, including a comprehensive ar-
5	thritis control and prevention plan that—

- "(A) is developed with the advice of stakeholders from the public, private, and nonprofit sectors that have expertise relating to arthritis control, prevention, and treatment that increase the quality of life and decrease the level of disability;
- "(B) is intended to reduce the morbidity of arthritis, with priority on preventing and controlling arthritis in at-risk populations and reducing disparities in arthritis prevention, diagnosis, management, and quality of care in underserved populations;
- "(C) describes the arthritis-related services and activities to be undertaken or supported by the entity; and
- "(D) demonstrates the relationship the entity has with the community and local entities and how the entity plans to involve such community and local entities in carrying out the activities described in paragraph (1).

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1	"(3) USE OF FUNDS.—An eligible entity may use
2	amounts received under a grant awarded under this
3	subsection to conduct, in a manner consistent with
4	the comprehensive arthritis control and prevention
5	plan submitted by the entity in the application under
6	paragraph (2)—
7	"(A) public health surveillance and epide-
8	miological activities relating to the prevalence of
9	arthritis and assessment of disparities in arthri-
10	tis prevention, diagnosis, management, and care;
11	"(B) public information and education pro-
12	grams; and
13	"(C) education, training, and clinical skills
14	improvement activities for health professionals,
15	including allied health personnel.
16	"(4) Eligible entity.—For purposes of this
17	subsection, the term 'eligible entity' means a State or
18	an Indian tribe.
19	"(e) General Application.—The Secretary may
20	only award a grant under subsection (b) or (c) to an entity
21	that submits to the Secretary an application at such time,
22	in such manner, and containing such agreements, assur-
23	ances, and information as the Secretary may require, in-
24	cluding a description of how funds received under a grant
25	awarded under such subsection will supplement or fulfill
