AN ACT

To establish the Waco Mammoth National Monument in the State of Texas, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Waco Mammoth Na-
- 5 tional Monument Establishment Act of 2009".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds as follows:

1	(1) The Waco Mammoth Site area is located						
2	near the confluence of the Brazos and the Bosque						
3	rivers in Central Texas, near the City of Waco.						
4	(2) Baylor University has been investigating the						
5	site since 1978 after the discovery of bones emerging						
6	from eroding creek banks leading to the uncovering						
7	of portions of five mammoths.						
8	(3) Several additional mammoth remains have						
9	been uncovered making this the largest known con-						
10	centration of mammoths dying from the same event.						
11	(4) The discoveries have received international						
12	attention.

- 4 (a) Establishment.—There is established the Waco

- 8 (b) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on file
- 9 and available for public inspection in the appropriate of-
- 10 fices of the National Park Service.

11 SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION OF NATIONAL MONUMENT.

- 12 (a) In General.—The Secretary shall administer
- 13 the national monument in accordance with this Act, the
- 14 cooperative agreements described in this section, and laws
- 15 and regulations generally applicable to units of the Na-
- 16 tional Park System, including the National Park Service
- 17 Organic Act (39 Stat. 535, 16 U.S.C. 1).
- 18 (b) Cooperative Agreements.—The Secretary
- 19 may enter into cooperative agreements for the manage-
- 20 ment of the national monument with Baylor University
- 21 and City of Waco, pursuant to the National Park Service
- 22 General Authorities Act (16 U.S.C. 1a–2(1)).

1	SEC. 6. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY AND BOUNDARY MAN-

3	(a) Acquisition of Property.—The Secretary is					
4	authorized to acquire from willing sellers lands, or inter-					
5	ests in lands, within the proposed boundary of the national					
6	monument necessary for effective management.					
7	(b) Conditions.—Lands identified in subsection (a)					
8	may be acquired—					
9	(1) by donation, purchase with donated or ap-					
10	propriated funds, transfer from another Federal					
11	agency, or by exchange; and					
12	(2) in the case of lands owned by the State of					
13	Texas, or a political subdivision thereof, or Baylor					
14	University only by donation or exchange.					
15	SEC. 7. CONSTRUCTION OF FACILITIES ON NONFEDERAL					
16	LANDS.					
17	(a) In General.—The Secretary is authorized, sub-					
18	ject to the appropriation of necessary funds, to construct					
19	essential administrative or visitor use facilities on non-					
20	Federal lands within the national monument.					
21	(b) Other Funding.—In addition to the use of Fed-					
22	eral funds authorized in subsection (a), the Secretary may					
23	use donated funds, property, and services to carry out this					
24	section.					

1 SEC. 8. GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.

2	(a) In General.—Not later than three years after						
3	the date on which funds are made available to carry o						
4	this Act, the Secretary, in consultation with Baylor Un						
5	versity and City of Waco, shall prepare a managemen						
6	plan for the national monument.						
7	(b) Inclusions.—The management plan shall in						
8	clude, at a minimum—						
9	(1) measures for the preservation of the re-						
10	sources of the national monument;						
11	(2) requirements for the type and extent of de-						
12	velopment and use of the national monument;						
13	(3) identification of visitor carrying capacities						
14	for national monument; and						
15	(4) opportunities for involvement by Baylon						
16	University, the City of Waco, the State of Texas						
17	and other local and national entities in the formula-						

tion of educational programs for the national monu-
