3 (a) IN GENERAL.—In the case of Federal civilian em4 ployees described in subsection (b), section 5543 of title
5 5, United States Code, shall be applied as if such section
6 had been amended—

7 (1) in subsections (a)(1) and (b), by striking
8 "an equal amount of time" and inserting "one and
9 one-half times the amount of time"; and

10 (2) in subsection (a)(2), by striking "equal to
11 the amount of time" and inserting "equal to one and
12 one-half times the amount of time".

(b) EMPLOYEES DESCRIBED.—This Act applies in
the case of Federal civilian employees serving at any of
the following:

22 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

23 This Act shall apply with respect to overtime work24 performed in any pay period beginning after the end of

- 1 the 120-day period beginning on the date of the enactment
