### 111TH CONGRESS 1ST SESSION H.R. 1416

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to expand the capability of the Department of Veterans Affairs to provide for the medical-care needs of veterans in southern New Jersey.

# A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to expand the capability of the Department of Veterans Affairs to provide for the medical-care needs of veterans in southern New Jersey.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Southern New Jersey

5 Veterans Comprehensive Health Care Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS; DEFINITION.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

(1) The current and future health-care needs of
 veterans residing in the eight southern counties of
 New Jersey are not being fully met by the Depart ment of Veterans Affairs.

(2) Travel times for southern New Jersey vet-5 6 erans to existing Department of Veterans Affairs 7 health-care facilities in Pennsylvania and Delaware 8 fall within the Department of Veterans Affairs 9 health-planning criteria, but those criteria fail to 10 recognize that the area is largely rural and its road-11 ways are congested, creating significant access bar-12 riers to veterans in need of care and thereby result-13 ing in suppressed demand for care.

(3) Projections of future growth in demand for
health care by veterans in southern New Jersey support sustainable enrollment of veterans needing Department of Veterans Affairs health care.

18 (4) The number of veterans residing in south-19 ern New Jersey is increasing as more veterans retire 20 in the area and new veterans seek services in the 21 wake of large-scale deployments of National Guard 22 and Reservists from the area. According to United 23 States census data, the veteran population in the 24 eight counties of southern New Jersey is greater 25 than 235,000.

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(b) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this Act, the term
 "southern New Jersey" means the following counties of
 the State of New Jersey: Ocean, Burlington, Camden,
 Gloucester, Salem, Cumberland, Atlantic, and Cape May.
 SEC. 3. MEDICAL CARE FOR VETERANS IN SOUTHERN NEW
 JERSEY.

7 (a) DETERMINATION.—Not later than 90 days after 8 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of 9 Veterans Affairs shall determine, and notify Congress pur-10 suant to subsection (b), whether the needs of veterans in 11 southern New Jersey for full-service medical care shall be 12 met—

(1) through a project to provide inpatient and
outpatient services and long-term care to veterans at
an existing facility in southern New Jersey; or

16 (2) through a project for construction of a new
17 full-service Department of Veterans Affairs medical
18 center to provide inpatient and outpatient services
19 and long-term care to veterans with an appropriate
20 number of beds and services in southern New Jer21 sey.

(b) NOTIFICATION AND PROSPECTUS.—Not later
than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall submit to Congress
a report—

(1) identifying which of the two options speci fied in subsection (a) has been selected by the Sec retary; and

4 (2) providing, for the option selected, a pro5 spectus that includes, at a minimum, the matter
6 specified in paragraphs (1) through (8) of section
7 8104(b) of title 38, United States Code, and the
8 project time lines.

## 9 SEC. 4. EXISTING FACILITY OPTION FOR MEDICAL CARE 10 FOR VETERANS IN SOUTHERN NEW JERSEY.

11 (a) PROJECT.—If the option selected by the Sec-12 retary of Veterans Affairs under section 3(a) is the option 13 specified in paragraph (1) of that section for a project to provide inpatient and outpatient services and long-term 14 15 care to veterans at an existing facility in southern New Jersey, then the Secretary shall, subject to the availability 16 17 of appropriations for such purpose, take such steps as necessary to enter into an agreement with an appropriate pri-18 vate-sector entity to provide for such services and care for 19 veterans at an existing facility in southern New Jersey. 20 21 Such an agreement may include provision for construction 22 of a new wing or other addition at such facility to provide 23 additional services that will, under the agreement, be 24 leased by the United States and dedicated to care and

treatment of veterans by the Secretary under title 38,
 United States Code.

3 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
4 authorized to be appropriated such sums as necessary for
5 a public-private venture project under this section.

# 6 SEC. 5. NEW DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS MED7 ICAL CENTER, SOUTHERN NEW JERSEY.

8 (a) **PROJECT** AUTHORIZATION.—If the option se-9 lected by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs under section 10 3(a) is the option specified in paragraph (2) of that section for a project for construction of a new full-service Depart-11 ment of Veterans Affairs medical center providing inpa-12 13 tient and outpatient services and long-term care to veterans with an appropriate number of beds in southern 14 15 New Jersey, then the Secretary shall, subject to the availability of appropriations for such purpose, carry out a 16 17 major medical facility construction project for construction in southern New Jersey of such a medical facility. 18 19 Such facility shall be located in the county in southern 20 New Jersey that the Secretary determines most suitable 21 to meet the health-care needs of veterans in the region. 22 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is 23 authorized to be appropriated to the Construction, Major 24 Projects account of the Department of Veterans Affairs, 25 in addition to any other amounts authorized for that ac-
