Mr. COFFMAN (for himself, Mr. ABRAHAM, Ms. DELAURO, and Mr. TAKANO) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to provide for the circumstances under which the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall provide reimbursement for emergency ambulance services.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Veterans Reimburse-
5 ment for Emergency Ambulance Services Act” or the
6 “VREASA”.

1 **SEC. 2. SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS REIMBURSE-**
2 **MENT FOR EMERGENCY AMBULANCE SERV-**
3 **ICES.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1725(c) of title 38,
5 United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the
6 following new paragraph:

7 “(5) In delineating the circumstances under which re-
8 imbursement may be made under this section for ambu-
9 lance services for an individual, the Secretary shall treat
10 such services as emergency services for which reimburse-
11 ment may be made under this section if the Secretary de-
12 termines that—

13 “(A) the request for ambulance services was
14 made as a result of the sudden onset of a medical
15 condition of such a nature that a prudent layperson
16 who possesses an average knowledge of health and
17 medicine—

18 “(i) would have reasonably expected that a
19 delay in seeking immediate medical attention
20 would have been hazardous to the life or health
21 of the individual; or

22 “(ii) could reasonably expect the absence
23 of immediate medical attention to result in
24 placing the health of the individual in serious
25 jeopardy, the serious impairment of bodily func-

1 tions, or the serious dysfunction of any bodily
2 organ or part; and

3 “(B) the individual is transported to the closest
4 and most appropriate medical facility capable of
5 treating such emergency medical condition.”.

6 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
7 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to ambulance serv-
8 ices provided on or after January 1, 2017.

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
