A BILL

- To establish a health registry to ensure that certain individuals who may have been exposed to formaldehyde in a travel trailer have an opportunity to register for such registry and receive medical treatment for such exposure, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Travel Trailer Resi-5 dents' Health Registry Act".

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1 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF REGISTRY.

Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of Health and Human Services, shall—

6 (1) establish and maintain a health registry for
7 eligible individuals who may have been exposed to
8 formaldehyde in a travel trailer;

9 (2) include any information in such registry 10 that the Secretary of Health and Human Services 11 determines necessary to ascertain and monitor the 12 health effects of the exposure to formaldehyde in a 13 travel trailer by eligible individuals;

(3) develop a public information campaign to
inform eligible individuals about the health registry,
including how and where to register and the benefits
of registering; and

(4) periodically notify eligible individuals of significant developments in the study and treatment of
conditions associated with exposure to formaldehyde.

21 SEC. 3. TREATMENT AND STUDY OF HEALTH EFFECTS.

22 (a) EXAMINATION OF ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland
Security shall enter into an agreement with the Secretary of Health and Human Services to provide initial and ongoing health examinations, consultations,
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1	and mental health counseling free of charge to each
2	eligible individual for the purposes of—
3	(A) assisting eligible individuals with any
4	health effects associated with exposure to form-
5	aldehyde in a travel trailer;
6	(B) ascertaining and monitoring the health
7	effects on each eligible individual of exposure to
8	formaldehyde in such a trailer; and
9	(C) completing the epidemiological study
10	required under subsection (b).
11	(2) INFORMATION FEEDBACK.—Such health
12	consultation and mental health counseling described
13	in paragraph (1) shall provide to each eligible indi-
14	vidual information regarding the examination results
15	for such individual, as well as any available informa-
16	tion concerning ongoing developments in the study
17	and treatment of conditions associated with exposure
18	to formaldehyde.
19	(b) EPIDEMIOLOGICAL STUDY.—Not later than 90
20	days after the establishment of the health registry under
21	section 2, the Secretary of Health and Human Services
22	shall commence an epidemiological study of the immediate
23	and long-term effects of exposure to formaldehyde in a
24	travel trailer sufficient to further understand the imme-
25	diate and long-term medical needs of eligible individuals.

1 SEC. 4. REPORT TO CONGRESS.

(a) REPORT BY INDEPENDENT SCIENTIFIC ORGANIZATION.—The Secretary of Health and Human Services
shall enter into an agreement with an independent scientific organization to submit a report to Congress, not
later than 18 months after the establishment of the registry, containing the following:

8 (1) EFFECTIVENESS OF SECRETARIES.—An as-9 sessment of the effectiveness of actions taken by the 10 Secretaries of the Department of Homeland Security 11 and the Department of Health and Human Services 12 to collect and maintain information on the health 13 consequences of exposure to formaldehyde in a travel 14 trailer.

15 (2) COLLECTION AND MAINTENANCE.—Rec16 ommendations to improve the collection and mainte17 nance of such information.

18 (3) MEDICAL NEEDS.—Using the ongoing epi19 demiological study under section 3(b), recommenda20 tions regarding the most effective and prudent
21 means of addressing the medical needs of eligible in22 dividuals, as such needs relate to conditions likely to
23 result from exposure to formaldehyde in a travel
24 trailer.

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1 SEC. 5. FUNDING.

2 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums3 as may be necessary to carry out this Act.

4 SEC. 6. DEFINITIONS.

(a) TRAVEL TRAILERS.—For the purposes of this
Act, the term "travel trailer" means any temporary housing unit provided by the Federal Government to individuals displaced by a major disaster that occurred or occurs
between August 29, 2005, and December 31, 2009.

10 (b) ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.—For the purposes of 11 this Act, the term "eligible individual" means any indi-12 vidual who—

13 (1) lawfully resided in a travel trailer; and

14 (2) applied or applies for inclusion on the15 health registry established pursuant to this Act.

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
