A BILL

To repeal certain foreign affairs reporting requirements.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF CERTAIN FOREIGN AFFAIRS RE-**
4 **PORTING REQUIREMENTS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The following provisions of law
6 are repealed:

7 (1) Section 404 of the Arms Control and Disar-
8 mament Act (22 U.S.C. 2593b), relating to public
9 annual report on world military expenditures and
10 arms transfers.

11 (2) Section 5 of the Act entitled “An Act to es-
12 tablish a Commission on Security and Cooperation

1 in Europe”, approved June 3, 1976 (Public Law
2 94–304; 22 U.S.C. 3005), relating to annual report
3 on the Commission on Security and Cooperation in
4 Europe.

5 (3) Subsection (c) of section 702 of the Foreign
6 Service Act of 1980 (22 U.S.C. 4022), relating to
7 annual report on foreign language competence.

8 (4) Subsection (b) of section 502 of the Inter-
9 national Security and Development Cooperation Act
10 of 1985 (22 U.S.C. 2349aa–7), relating to report on
11 assistance relating to international terrorism.

12 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 502 of the
13 International Security and Development Cooperation Act
14 of 1985 (22 U.S.C. 2349aa–7) is amended by redesign-
15 nating subsection (c) as subsection (b).
