A BILL

- To require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to submit to Congress an annual report on projects that are over budget and behind schedule, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Billion Dollar Boon-5 doggle Act of 2019".

1 SEC. 2. ANNUAL REPORT.

2 (a) DEFINITION OF COVERED AGENCY.—In this sec3 tion, the term "covered agency" means—

4 (1) an Executive agency, as defined in section
5 105 of title 5, United States Code; and

6 (2) an independent regulatory agency, as de7 fined in section 3502 of title 44, United States
8 Code.

9 (b) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 1 year after the 10 date of enactment of this Act, and every year thereafter, 11 the Director of the Office of Management and Budget 12 shall submit to Congress and post on the website of the 13 Office of Management and Budget a report on each 14 project funded by a covered agency—

15 (1) that is more than 5 years behind schedule;16 or

17 (2) for which the amount spent on the project
18 is not less than \$1,000,000,000 more than the origi19 nal cost estimate for the project.

20 (c) CONTENTS.—Each report submitted and posted
21 under subsection (b) shall include, for each project in22 cluded in the report—

23 (1) a brief description of the project, includ24 ing—

25 (A) the purpose of the project;

1	(B) each location in which the project is
2	carried out;
3	(C) the year in which the project was initi-
4	ated;
5	(D) the Federal share of the total cost of
6	the project; and
7	(E) each primary contractor, subcon-
8	tractor, grant recipient, and subgrantee recipi-
9	ent of the project;
10	(2) an explanation of any change to the original
11	scope of the project, including by the addition or
12	narrowing of the initial requirements of the project;
13	(3) the original expected date for completion of
14	the project;
15	(4) the current expected date for completion of
16	the project;
17	(5) the original cost estimate for the project, as
18	adjusted to reflect increases in the Consumer Price
19	Index for All Urban Consumers, as published by the
20	Bureau of Labor Statistics;
21	(6) the current cost estimate for the project, as
22	adjusted to reflect increases in the Consumer Price
23	Index for All Urban Consumers, as published by the
24	Bureau of Labor Statistics;

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(7) an explanation for a delay in completion or
 increase in the original cost estimate for the project;
 and
 (8) the amount of and rationale for any award,
 incentive fee, or other type of bonus, if any, awarded

7 (d) SUBMISSION WITH BUDGET.—Section 1105(a) of
8 title 31, United States Code, is amended by adding at the

calendar year in which the fiscal year covered by the
budget begins.".

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
