A BILL

To amend title 37, United States Code, to ensure that a member of a reserve component of a uniformed service, who performs active service for more than 30 consecutive days under multiple calls or orders to active service that specify periods of 30 days or less, is paid the same basic allowance for housing as a similarly situated member of a reserve component called or ordered to active service for a period of more than 30 days.

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “National Guard Hous-
3 ing Equity Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. PARITY IN BASIC ALLOWANCE FOR HOUSING FOR**
5 **MEMBERS OF THE RESERVE COMPONENTS**
6 **WHO SERVE FOR MORE THAN 30 CONSECU-**
7 **TIVE DAYS UNDER MULTIPLE CALLS OR OR-**
8 **DERS TO ACTIVE SERVICE.**

9 Section 403(g)(5) of title 37, United States Code, is
10 amended—

11 (1) by inserting “(A)” before “The Secretary”;

12 and

13 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
14 paragraph:

15 “(B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), a member
16 of a reserve component, who performs active service for
17 more than 30 consecutive days under multiple calls or or-
18 ders to active service that specify periods of 30 days or
19 less, shall be paid the same basic allowance for housing
20 as a similarly situated member of a reserve component
21 who is called or ordered to active service for a period of
22 more than 30 days.”.
